HAVE YOU GOT LAND THAT WOULD BENEFIT FROM NATIVE TREE PLANTING?



Our Regional Advisors work throughout the country to identify landowners and work with them to plan and help manage long-term native planting projects. We look for land of all sizes in both rural and urban areas.

Trees That Count is a national campaign which aims to bring together business, community and everyday Kiwis to help plant 200 million native trees. We're building a picture of the planting efforts in New Zealand every year by counting the native trees which are planted. By doing this we can measure the collective impact of this work. **But we want to see millions more planted, and we need more land to plant on.**

FUNDED TREES

Landowners are often eligible for free native trees through our online marketplace. We encourage landowners to apply for funded trees from us, even if they've received trees from other grants (such as from the 1 Billion Trees).

We encourage landowners to register any native tree plantings – both old and new – with Trees That Count. Anyone who has previously added to our count can then apply for more native trees to plant.

PLEDGING YOUR LAND FOR NATIVE PLANTING OR REGENERATION

Smaller parcels of land under 100ha are perfect for restoration planting with young native trees.

For land areas over 100ha, allowing the land to regenerate naturally may be an option. This involves fencing off areas where natives can self-seed or with some supplementary planting to help. These areas are in high demand for carbon offsetting.

WE'LL WORK WITH YOU

Trees That Count also provides technical advice about the planting of native trees, particularly as part of the One Billion Tree programme. We work from a regional planning level right down to site-specific advice and assistance to landowners and planting groups, so we have a full picture of the needs and opportunities in each region.
